## RESIDENTIAL RECYCLING



**Recycling is picked up every other week on Thursdays. Please put bin out by the curb by 6:00 am on Thursdays. Please remember that we will not be picking up any residential trash on the recycling route. Since the recycling is a free service, we limit it to the 2 bins + 1 13-gallon bag.**

### What CAN I recycle?

1. **PLASTICS #1 & #2:** You can tell if it's a #1(PET) or #2 (HDPE) usually by looking on the bottom of container. These are most commonly plastic milk jugs, plastic orange juice containers, beverage bottles.

#### Tips:

- Remove caps and paper, throw in garbage
- Rinse containers
- Flatten to conserve space

2. **Aluminum Cans:** Beverage, vegetable/soup cans (no pet food cans) and pie plate pans that have been cleaned

#### Tips:

- Flatten to conserve space

3. **Newspapers and Magazines** – No junk mail accepted

4. **Paper** – Cereal boxes, frozen food boxes, shoe boxes, egg cartons – must be flattened

5. **Glass Bottles and Jars** – Clear, Green, Brown. **NO BROKEN GLASS ACCEPTED**

#### Tips:

- Remove caps and wrappings
- Rinse out

### What CAN'T I recycle?

Plastics not numbered 1 or 2, plastic bags, window glass, light bulbs, mirrors, coat hangers, aerosol cans, aluminum foil, heavy cardboard boxes, styrofoam, office paper, computer paper, soiled paper, yard debris and tires.

**IT IS NOT NECESSARY TO BAG THE RECYCLABLE ITEMS BEFORE BEING PLACED IN THE BIN.**
